Working members are entitled to full privileges, including a key to the clubhouse, a mooring space or kayak/canoe rack space, a personal locker, rights to winter storage and full voting rights. To keep our fees affordable, working members are also expected to provide 30 hours of work duties per season, this could be painting, cleaning, carpentry, or whatever skills you can bring to the facility. Working membership dues are currently \$440 per year.
