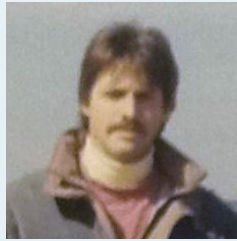

River – with everyone important in your life next to you.

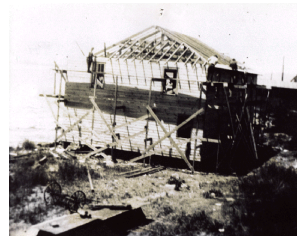

## Community Involvement

OBCC is host to both the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and the Community Sailing Club. We also sponsor a scholarship and Toys for Tots. We monitor the Town Boat Ramp and assist boaters. We maintain and improve the clubhouse at no direct cost to the Town. Our membership is open to all people to enjoy the river.

Working members are entitled to full privileges, including a key to the clubhouse, a mooring space or kayak/canoe rack space, a personal locker, rights to winter storage and full voting rights. To keep our fees affordable, working members are also expected to provide 30 hours of work duties per season, this could be painting, cleaning, carpentry, or whatever skills you can bring to the facility. Working membership dues are currently \$440 per year.
